THE CHURCH

What church community do I want my funeral to be celebrated within? Your church can be a valuable resource to help you clarify your wishes and give guidance to your survivors. They will work with you in planning the Catholic funeral rites. Pre-planning your funeral Mass or Memorial Service includes:

- Vigil Service (Wake)
- Visitation preceding the funeral
- Mass / Memorial Service
- Readings
- Music
- Eulogies
- Luncheon
- Accommodations for visitors



THE FUNERAL HOME

A Funeral Home helps to put into action those choices you've made, both at the church and the cemetery. By pre-planning, you have the time to view all the possible options. You will know if a particular funeral home can meet your needs, especially if you have special wishes, such as natural burial. You can gather all the information you need prior to making a decision.

Things to know about choosing a funeral home:

- They will be your first call after someone dies, since they are licensed to handle a body.
- Caskets and full-body vaults are purchased through them.
- They are there to assist you in planning a visitation/memorial service if you wish to have one.



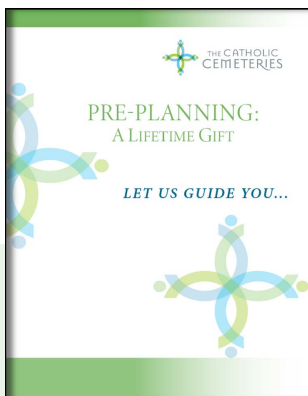
THE CEMETERY

MAKE OR UPDATE YOUR WILL

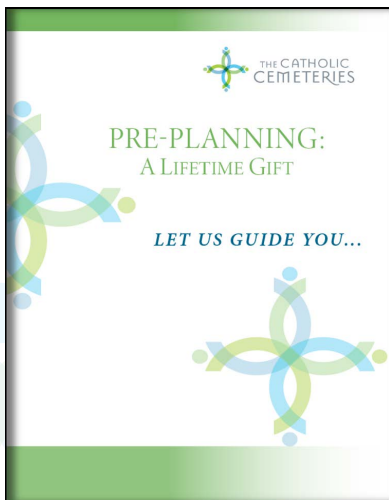

Without a will, a probate judge makes these decisions and the cost can be as high as ten percent of your net estate.

LOCATE IMPORTANT DOCUMENTS

The greatest loss of revenue to most estates is due to the failure to locate critical documents, including those that are personal, financial and insurance related. These documents must be conveniently stored and not kept in a safe deposit box.
